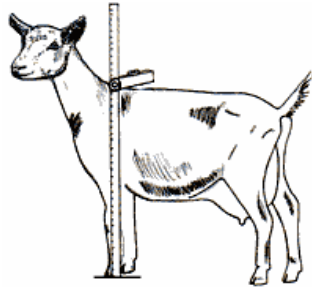

Mini-Myotonic Goat Certification Requirements

1. Mini certification is open to myotonic bucks and does who meet all requirements of registration as adopted by the IFGA.
2. Height requirements for mini certification:
Bucks – less than 23 inches at the withers
Does - less than 22 inches at the withers



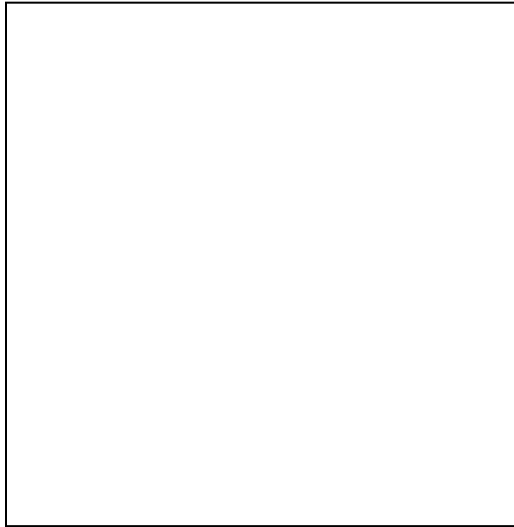
3. Although myotonics may be registered at any age with the IFGA, they cannot be certified as a mini-myotonic until they reach 3 years of age.
4. If you are registering your mini myotonic for the first time and it has not reached 3 years of age you must complete the Registration Application and submit it to the Registrar with the necessary 3 pictures (see number 5 below) and the registration fee of \$15.00 for members or \$30.00 for non-members.

When your animal attains 3 years of age you may file for mini certification provided the height requirements are met. You must complete the Mini-Myotonic Certification Form and submit it to the Registrar with a picture of the animal, original registration certificate, and the registration fee of \$8.00 for members or \$12.00 for non-members. Pictures may be of the same side of the animal and one will be returned with your new Registration Certificate and the other will remain on file with the IFGA.

5. Photographs are required to register animals in all categories as outlined below.
 1. Premium – 3 photographs. 1 photo in a fallen down position, 1 photo of the left side and 1 photo of the right side.
 2. Regular – 3 photographs. 1 photo in a stiff-legged position, 1 photo of the left side and 1 photo of the right side.

- 3 Heritage – 3 photographs. 1 photo in a fallen down position, 1 photo of the left side and 1 photo of the right side.

Photographs must be clear, of appropriate size, and free of obstruction. The allotted space on the registration certificate is 3 inches wide by 3 inches high, and your photos should be no larger than this. The actual size of the goat in the photo must be at least 1½ inches from the top of the head to the feed. There should be no obstacles between you and the goat. Do not take pictures through a fence or with other goats in the foreground. Your pictures should be sized to fit this box.



Whenever possible you should not take pictures with other goats in the background or showing the handler. Take your pictures on a sunny day with the sun behind the camera. Dark and shadowy pictures are difficult to see. Position your goat to get a full side view. Do not take photos with the goat at any angle as their markings are not clearly visible.

If you are using a digital camera please print pictures on high quality photo paper using a good quality color printer. Please do not submit Polaroid pictures as they separate when cut and deteriorate with age.
